




VISION & MISSION

Introducing the East Bali Poverty Project (EBPP)

Vision

That every child in rural Indonesia has access to good healthcare, nutrition, education, clean water, sanitation and opportunities to achieve his/her full potential and empower others

Mission

To create sustainable solutions to poverty in rural Indonesia mountain villages, prioritizing the health, nutrition and education of children.

Absolute Poverty in 15 Isolated Ban Village Hamlets

- "Absolute poverty, defined as "a condition characterized by severe deprivation of basic human needs, including food, safe drinking water, sanitation facilities, health, shelter, education and information. It depends not only on income but also on access to services" ("Poverty | United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization")
- You'll see from the next slides that in 1998-99 most of the 19 Ban village hamlets lacked all of the basic human needs characterized as 'absolute poverty'

THE BARREN EAST BALL MOUNTAIN SLOPES in 1998


THE MUTUAL "TRUST": 3 PROMISES FROM EBPP & COMMUNITY

 When the Ban village community asked us to help in 1998, we established a foundation of mutual "Trust": 3 promises from EBPP and 3 from them, which we all signed (majority of them by thumbprint because they could not write) vis:

EBPP	The 15 Dusun Leaders
1. No promises: I'll do my best;	1. 100% Motivation, and
2. No handouts of money, rice or anything free;	2. 100% participation in what they aspire for the future and I help them to get there with appropriate knowledge;
3. If there is any corruption, collusion or nepotism in anything we started, we would immediately quit	3. To agree to be interviewed and honest because there is no available data from government about their lives

- After analysing the 1,056 questionnaires (each had 52 questions), it was clear that the 6 most remote dusun were most disadvantaged and the Kepala Desa asked us to priorities them first.
- When asked their priority if we could help, they all requested "Educate our children so they can lead us to a better life"



1998 - 2001

No local health facilities, nearest health centre average 20 km away on foot. Nearest Hospital 55 km

2001 - 2008

- •27 Posyandu established for 1,400 mothers & 1,600 infants 0-5 years
- •Annual iodine and vit. A supplements
- •Birth control
- •First time vaccinations for all babies & children


KEY EBPP ACHIEVEMENTS TOWARD ALLEVIATING ABSOLUTE POVERTY 1998-2021


- 1. DIRT ROAD IMPROVEMENT: More than 25km facilitating access for over 3,700 families:
- 2. COMPREHENSIVE COMMUNITY HEALTH OUTREACH PROGRAMS: Benefitting >6,000 families, include:
 - Acute Iodine Deficiency Disorders (IDD): 1998 Nationwide study...
 - Maternal child health since 1999: Reduced child mortality from 30% to age 1 in 1999/2000 to zero
 - Posyandu, Initiated 27 in 2003: benefitting up to 1,400 mothers & 1,600 infants 0-5 monthly;
 - Malnourished babies/infants: Supported 111 severely and 244 moderately malnourished children;
 - Dental Healthcare for children annually since 2000: Served 31,300 children from 51 schools in 5 villages;
 - Ear Nose & Throat [ENT] examinations for children in 51 schools : >10,660 children & adults;
 - Physiotherapy Weekly for paralysed/disabled children & adults: 73 children & adults since 2005;
 - Cleft palate, cataract and eye examination & operations since 1999: 91 children & 300 adults.
- 3. SAFE WATER SUPPLY FOR 2,400 FAMILIES: From mountain springs, artesian wells and cubang
- 4. SANITATION: 1,262 toilet/bathroom blocks provided for 1,515 families in 13 of the 19 Ban Village hamlets
- 5. EDUCATION: 1,200 children educated in 6 EBPP schools since 1999; 104 graduated senior high school
- 6. TERTIARY EDUCATION: 19 graduates sponsored to college/university 2005 2021
- 7. ORGANIC VEGETABLE & HERB FARMING: EBPP school children & 500 families in 6 hamlets: 2000-2015
- 8. BAMBOO: 80,000 PLANTED IN 200Ha for reforestation, environmental rehabilitation, carbon sequestration & sustainable community economic development:
- 9. BAMBOO BIKES & PRODUCTS SOCIAL ENTERPRISE 2017+
